Background/Introduction

Attached is the most recent report from the Education Committee

In April FSEM and NCSEM held a series of evening seminars on Physical Activity, which attracted 670 delegates over the 4 events, of which 420 were registered for all four events. I haven't seen the delegate feedback, but the general feeling is that they were very successful. High quality speakers and good delegate numbers as well as really good engagement with questions and discussion. Each session included someone with "lived experience" of the issues being discussed and their involvement really helped to put the academic talks into context.

The timing and format for the event next year will be discussed at our next joint NCSEM/FSEM meeting.

As the FSEM Education rep I have attended several planning meetings for the annual BASEM conference. The conference was due to be held in November, but it has been deferred to 26/27 May 2022 instead, with the expectation that delegates will be able to attend in person by then.

The conference will be held in Brighton with a similar programme. FSEM have two sessions scheduled, one on Moving Medicine/Exercise Medicine and the other initially pencilled in as "Return to sport after Covid". The latter may be less relevant by then so the topic is open to discussion.

BASEM are holding a delayed spring meeting on Friday 28 May 2021 on Hip and Groin pathologies. The meeting is online and free. 4500 delegates registered so far. https://www.econgress.gr/future-econgress/basemspring2021
