**Summary Report**

The new contract with OHID and SE is underway. The evidence reviews have been completed for the 4 new modules, and updates are underway for the 10 original modules. If there is anyone who would be interested in providing feedback via the online consultation for any of the modules, please contact the team. We are looking for launch opportunities for the new modules (Menopause, Anxiety, Type 1 Diabetes and Obesity ).

Microsites have launched in Calderdale and Oxford and work is now being done on dissemination here. We would welcome any links you may have with SEM colleagues who work in these areas. The Birmingham microsite is due to be live at the end of the month, with further launch planned.

The Consensus statement was launched in November and published in the BJSM – congratulations to everyone involved in this important piece of work.

The January Active Conversations course has commenced, and there have also been people undertaking the Foundations course. This course is also offered for free to the lead teams involved with the development of new and existing modules. We have applied for accreditation for the course from the European Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (EACCME) and hope to receive this within the first half of 2022. This will enable us to sell the course via the ACSM and offers huge potential income streams.

Dissemination is now being done in conjunction with FSEM marketing and comms led by Ian Williamson.

We continue to receive enquiries from other hospitals who wish to use learning from the Active Hospital work featured on the website and are yet to hear from OHID and the NHS Transformation Unit regarding conversations we have had previously surrounding updates to the toolkit and the inclusion of new case studies.

We have a working group who are looking to develop a Faculty Exercise Medicine Diploma, and Dr Chris Speers has kindly agreed to lead on this development.
