The Role:

We require Fellows, Members or Diplomate Members with current or recent experience in delivering healthcare to individual and/or team athletes. You must be well motivated, organised and willing to contribute time and energy to successful achievement of the Faculty and Team Care strategy aims.

The Team Care Committee is the newest committee for FSEM. It will focus on developing and setting professional standards for healthcare professionals working with individual and team based athletes in the field of Team Care. This will support high quality, safe, professional practice, and develop policy and partnerships with national stakeholders. This committee has evolved from the previous Elite Sport Committee, who will now become an advisory group to the Team Care Committee. This new committee will continue to build on the progress they have already made.

Key responsibilities and commitment:

- Voluntary engagement to lead, collaborate and develop content for specific allocated work streams within the Team Care strategy. This will involve aspects of leadership, teamwork, project management and personal delivery of required work to meet specific deadlines.
- Mandatory attendance and appropriate engagement at Team Care Committee meetings, four times a year. These are likely to be virtual with the occasional in person meeting if required by a particular work stream or activity.

• Potential requirement to attend meetings on FSEM's behalf such national meetings or conferences related to Team Care.

- Current or recent (within three years) experience in providing healthcare to individual or team athletes.
- Desirable experience and/or education in leadership
- Desirable experience and/or education in project management
