Moving Medicine is a core strand of our mission to improve the health of the nation through physical activity and continues to evolve through innovative cross-sector projects such as Moving Together.

### **About the Role**

The Patient Project Coordinator will play a pivotal role in supporting and delivering two significant programmes:

- The Sport England Moving Together project, which seeks to reduce barriers to physical activity for people living with long-term conditions across sectors.
- The Nuffield Health partnership, which focuses on replacing mandated medical clearance with person-centred guidance to support safer and more inclusive participation in physical activity.

The Moving Together and Nuffield Health projects are at a critical stage of development, with growing engagement from patients, healthcare professionals, and partners across the fitness and physical activity sectors. This role will provide essential coordination to ensure delivery of agreed milestones, alignment with equality, diversity and inclusion commitments, and effective evaluation and reporting.

The successful candidate will join a small, committed Faculty team working in partnership with a broad network of national stakeholders. This role offers the opportunity to contribute to meaningful change in the way people with long-term conditions are supported to engage in physical activity, and to play a key part in advancing the Faculty's vision to improve the health of the nation.
