



BASEM

Charitable Company



Board of Trustees

- The BASEM Non-Executive Board is a group of individuals who are members of BASEM and Doctors/Allied Professionals either employed or retired from their profession.
- Elected and appointed as Directors of the Association and Trustees of the Charity.
- Each Director Board Member volunteers their time and is responsible for the management and decision making to ensure aims and objectives of the Association are met in accordance with BASEM's governing documents, and Charity and Company Law.

Committees

- Several committees to support the staff and Board achieve their objectives who report to the Board.

Board of Trustees

- FSEM Board is made up of both elected members (5 Office Bearers) and up to 4 lay Trustees.
- The broad skill mix and diversity of experience supports our organisational aims.
- The Board hold the legal responsibility for the overall management, strategic direction, and compliance of the organisation to ensure it fulfils its charitable purposes.

Council

- Council meets and develops FSEM's policy and direction in relation to professional and clinical matters.
- Council also considers and acts on current issues affecting professional practice and standards.
- Council is made up of 5 Office Bearers, and 12 elected Fellows or Members with voting rights – they're elected by all members and Fellows. The President and Vice-Presidents roles are elected by Fellows.
- FSEM also co-opts representatives of those involved in the FSEM's work e.g. Chair of Committee. The Council is also supported by a wide range of sub-committees.

Committees

Several committees to support the staff, Council and Board achieve their objectives who report to Council.



CSEM

Charitable Company registered with CCEW and OSCR



Board of Trustees

- CSEM Board will be made up of both elected members (5 Office Bearers who are Fellows by CCT) and up to 4 lay trustees.
- The Board will hold the overall responsibility for the vision of the Charitable Company and as well as a legal responsible.

Council

Council will meet to develop CSEM's policy and direction in relation to SEM as a profession and clinical matters.

Council will be made up of the following positions:

- 5 Elected Office Bearers (Fellows) – elected in by Council
- 8 Fellows – elected by Fellows
- 6 Members - elected by Members
- 4 Diplomates – elected by Diplomates members
- 1 SEM Resident – elected by SEM Residents members
- 1 Associate – elected by Associates members
- 1 Undergrade (non-voting) – elected by undergrads members

Other co-opted non-voting members to support out professional work.

Committees

Several committees to support the staff, Council and Board achieve their objectives who report to Council and/or Board.

Honorary Fellow	Honorary Fellows must represent their original membership category when voting or be elected on to Council, if not a previous member no vote.
Member	Yes – 6 on Council
Overseas Member	No

Overseas Diplomate Member	No
Retired Diplomate	No
SEM Resident	Yes – 1 on Council
Associate	Yes – 1 on Council
Undergraduate	No

Note: CSEM Council position are voted by their membership e.g. SEM Resident Doctor Members of CSEM will elect their representative on Council

BASEM

Board of Trustees

- Must be a Member
- Elected by Membership

AGM

All members - Full, Overseas, Undergraduate, Concessionary and Retired, can attend, speak and vote at general meetings of the Charity and to approve written resolutions of the Members.



FSEM

Board of Trustees

- Office Bearers - President and 2 Vice Presidents must be Fellows – they are elected by all Fellows;
- Office Bearers - Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer must be a Fellow, Member or Honorary Fellow – they are appointed by the Council.
- Up to 4 Lay Trustees are appointed by the Office Bearers

Council

Council is made up of 5 Office Bearers (election above) with voting rights on Council
& 12 elected Fellows or Members with voting rights on Council – they're elected by all members and Fellows.

AGM

All members can attend AGMs but only Fellows, Members and Diplomat Members can propose motions and vote and AGMs; this includes amendments to the **Standing Orders**.



CSEM

Board of Trustees

- Office Bearers - President, 2 Vice Presidents, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer must be Fellows – they are elected by all Council;
- Up to 4 Lay Trustees are appointed by the Office Bearers

Council

Council is made up of 5 Office Bearers (election above) with voting rights.
Plus

- 8 Fellows – elected by Fellows
- 6 Members - elected by Members
- 4 Diplomates – elected by Diplomates members
- 1 SEM Resident – elected by SEM Residents members
- 1 Associate – elected by Associates members

AGM

All members can attend AGMS but only Elected Council Members can vote at AGMs.

College Byelaws (FSEM previously called them Standing Orders)
Elected on Council Members can propose amendments and vote to change College Byelaws. All the membership can raise items of concerns through their elected membership category who represent their membership body.



Medical Leadership of CSEM

It is essential to maintain medical leadership to uphold the identity and credibility of the College, consistent with all medical Colleges and specialties.

- Under AoMRC requirements, the President and two Vice-Presidents of CSEM must be GMC-registered Medical Fellows (by CCT).
- This ensures the College's highest governance level remains medically led, guiding its strategic direction from that foundation.
- Consequently, all Fellow positions on both the Board and Council will be reserved for GMC-registered Fellows (by CCT).
